

Topic Overview: SMSC/PSHE/British Values:

Children will be immersed into the concept of 'CRUNCH! We will consider how this links to our values of respect through living a healthy lifestyle and respecting our bodies through exploring links in science. Throughout this topic, children will learn how food is digested in the body and the role of the teeth in breaking down food. This will then link to their geography work where they will explore different foods and weather diets around the world are considered to be healthy, as well as looking at the types of animals that and deciding on what their diet is like by analysing their types of teeth. Through PSHE we will consider respecting ourselves through thinking about 'It's Good to be Me challenging stereotyping.
