Respectful Romans

Topic Overview: SMSC/PSHE/British Values:

Within this topic, children focus on the Roman Empire and the impact it had on Roman Britain through exploring the key question of 'What was the Roman Empire's most significant impact? This links to our school value of achievement and children will explore what the Romans did for us and their legacy in Britain. As well as considering the achievements of the Roman Empire, they will also consider how this affected the lives of the Iron Age Britons (following on from the Stone Age topic). They will consider the impact it had on the Britons and how this affected their rights. This will allow them to explore their rights and what happens when rights are taken away.
