

**Topic Overview: SMSC/PSHE/British Values: Achieve, Respect**

In this topic children will *explore the achievements of the monarchs of Britain and Parliament over time and undertake an enquiry to understand and respect how our country is governed and the history of the monarchy*. Children will understand how the underpinning of the British Values throughout history have led to how we experience life today including democracy, Rule of Law, Respect and Tolerance. In history and reading, they will learn about the achievements of the monarchs through time and debate whether they believe they were respectful or not. They will follow the historical enquiry 'Why does parliament run the country rather than the King?' The children will be able to achieve in a physical capacity through their swimming lessons and will be able to experience creative achievement in design and technology.
