We strongly believe that home learning is integral to a good education. Both home and school should work together effectively to ensure your child is successful as a learner. The expectations in the classroom and the standards children are expected to achieve have changed significantly in recent years. Children need to be fluent readers and mathematicians to access the curriculum. If children do not practise core skills, they will struggle in the classroom.

Home learning will comprise of the following:

- Reading – An expectation to read 5 times a week for a minimum of 15 minutes. Reading is such a crucial life skill and influences so much of our work.
- Spellings – Learn weekly spellings via Spelling Shed
- Maths – Learn key number facts including times tables from 1 – 12 and the associated division facts. This may well be through TTRockstars or Sum Dog

It is crucial that children engage in these 3 areas of learning. Please support the school by playing your part as a parent and by encouraging your child to complete any home learning.

Individual year groups may set additional home learning to support a topic or theme. There will be an expectation that this is completed as well as reading, spellings and maths.

There may also be a greater expectation on Year 6 as part of a revision programme for SATs and transition to secondary school.
