Topic Overview: SMSC/PSHE/British Values: Achievement

The children will undertake a study of Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world: What aspects of Greek culture are still current today? How did aspects of Greek culture spread and survive past the Greek civilisation? Working reflectively and broadly across the curriculum, children will identify successes of their own and others. They will be immersed in Greek myths, identifying commonalities and drawing inspiration to plan, orally rehearse and then write their own 5-part Greek myth. They will work to develop 3D art skills using the medium of clay and inspired by ancient Greek pots.
