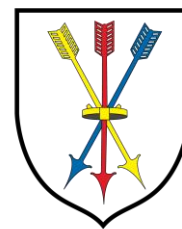

### 1. Purpose and principles

This Code of Conduct aims to establish a set of principles which underpin the expected conduct of pupils at Purbrook Junior School with the intention of encouraging pupils to achieve the highest standards of behaviour and work.

At Purbrook Junior School we want our children to 'Dream Big!' The vision is about being the best that you can be. We want everyone within the Purbrook community to have a growth mindset and aim high.

Underpinning our vision are three core values: Respect, Team and Achieve. As a school, we firmly believe that if we are respectful and work as a team, we will continue to achieve and improve even more both individually and collectively.

### 2. Children

#### Children should:

- Always be encouraged to be their best selves.
- Be kind and courteous to other children and adults within school
- Show respect and consideration for other children and adults.
- Show respect and consideration for property and the environment.
- Be responsible for their learning.
- Be accountable for their actions.
- Have high standards of behaviour (this is expected at school, home and in the community).
- Move around the school and its grounds in a quiet and orderly manner.
- Enter the school, classrooms and grounds only at authorised times.
- Wear the appropriate clothing and footwear for all school activities and visits. School uniform is encouraged.
- Only wear a pair of stud earrings and a watch as jewellery items.
- Clothing and other possessions must be named and are the responsibility of the owner.
- Hand in any mobile phones to the class teacher on arrival to school (ensuring they are switched off). These should be collected on departure from school.
- Bring any medicines or prescribed drugs which need to be taken in school time to the school office with the appropriate written permission and inform their class teacher.
- Show how to stay safe in person and online.
